

## Rubric (Explanation) Questions

For each assessment, you are required to include an explanation question at the start of the test with (at minimum) the following information:

- Module Code and assessment name
- Time limit – if there is no time limited associated then participants should be made aware
- Number of questions
- If negative marking is used – it is now compulsory under the University Regulations to include guidance on the marking scheme for all multiple-choice examinations
- Number of attempts allowed

Other things to include may be:

- Making students aware that the Submit button may not appear until they have viewed ALL questions
- If the assessment is worth a percentage of the overall module credit
- If any additional equipment may be used e.g. a calculator, pen or paper
- Number of marks each question is worth

Below are some exemplar explanation questions you may want to use for your assessments depending on the scenario.

### Invigilated timed single attempt

You have 1 hour to answer 20 questions. The Submit button will only appear once you have viewed all the questions.

The maximum marks available are indicated next to each question.

No additional stationery may be used.

### Non-invigilated timed limited attempts

According to the University minimum standards set out by the University in the Coursework Code of Practice it is academic misconduct for any candidate to obtain for himself/herself, or for another, an unfair advantage in any Computer Assisted Assessment assignment and the relevant sections of University Assessment Regulations shall apply.

You may attempt this test on one occasion only, unless you experience technical difficulties, in which case make a second attempt for the purpose of your module coursework mark. The second attempt will only count once we have verified (through tracking) that difficulties did arise, otherwise your first attempt will be used.

If you fail to attempt a test by the published deadline you shall receive a mark of zero for the assignment.

Feedback on performance in CAA assignments shall be provided to you in accordance with the University's Coursework Code of Practice.

You have 1 hour to answer 20 questions. The Submit button will only appear once you have viewed all the questions.

The maximum marks available are indicated next to each question.

This must be your own work.

### **Open access formative unlimited attempts**

This assessment is for revision purposes only. Your performance is not used for module credit.

Take the assessment as many times as you wish, individual question feedback will be given.

You have 1 hour to answer 20 questions. The Submit button will only appear once you have viewed all the questions.
